
29 of the last 30 polls under-estimated the Obama lead. Only one (Democracy Corps) was too high. p < 0.0000001!

It would have been a lot worse 2 weeks earlier.












Candidate Perceptions




Likability






Positive Candidate Perceptions



Turnout Rates for Registered Voters


Turnout by Gender (Registered Voters)




Turnout by Age (Registered Voters)
