THE BIG IDEA

How do positive and negative information affect voters' willingness to increase the federal minimum wage?

THEORETICAL SETTING

Political Atmosphere

• In March 2014, President Obama urged Congress to approve a minimum wage hike from \$7.25 to \$10.10.

Good vs Bad

- Bad outweighs the good (Baumeister et al 2001)
- Bad wears off more slowly

Information matters

- Voters respond to cues (Druckman 2004, Gillens 2001, Levendusky 2011)
- People tend to do what is expected, for greater good (Rogers 2014) → feel obligated to do whatever brings "good" outcome

→ How do good and bad information change voters' opinions?








DO YOU FAVOR OR OPPOSE AN INCREASE IN THE FEDERAL MINIMUM WAGE?




SUPPORT DIFFERENCE BY GENDER (% TREATMENT - % CONTROL)






Implications:

- Utah more conservative than other national polls (Bloomberg, CNN), though not greatly








EMPLOYMENT STATUS

Minimum Wage Increase Support by Employment Status






GENDER
